



Quick Tech Tips

- 1) Get that closed tab back! If you accidentally close out a web browser tab press "Control" "Shift" & "T" keys to reopen that tab.
- 2) On You Tube, you can use "K" to play or pause the video, "J" to rewind 10 secs and "L" to fast forward.
- 3) Zoom in or out while in your web browser by hitting "Control" + to zoom in or "Control" or "Control" 0 to set it to default zoom.

*Substitute "Control" with "Command" if you are using a Mac

Maintaining a budget or tracking expense can be difficult for an office professional, but there is an app that could be a solution. Expensify is an app that allows you to categorize, tag, and group expenses into a report. The SmartScan feature scans your receipt and reads the details for you making it a snap to get that business reimbursement for yourself or even your boss.

Pesto Chicken Florentine



20 m

Cook 35 m Ready In 55 m

Recipe By: MINERFAMILY

"Extremely rich combination of chicken, spinach and creamy pesto sauce. Serve with crunchy bread and romaine salad--it's the best!"

Ingredients

2 tablespoons olive oil

2 cloves garlic, finely chopped

4 skinless, boneless chicken breast

halves - cut into strips

2 cups fresh spinach leaves

1 (4.5 ounce) package dry Alfredo sauce mix

2 tablespoons pesto

1 (8 ounce) package dry penne pasta

1 tablespoon grated Romano cheese

Directions

- 1 Heat oil in a large skillet over medium high heat. Add garlic, saute for 1 minute; then add chicken and cook for 7 to 8 minutes on each side. When chicken is close to being cooked through (no longer pink inside), add spinach and saute all together for 3 to 4 minutes.
- 2 Meanwhile, prepare Alfredo sauce according to package directions. When finished, stir in 2 tablespoons pesto; set aside.
- 3 In a large pot of salted boiling water, cook pasta for 8 to 10 minutes or until al dente. Rinse under cold water and drain.
- 4 Add chicken/spinach mixture to pasta, then stir in pesto/Alfredo sauce. Mix well, top with cheese and serve.
